The port of Amsterdam is part of the Amsterdam Seaports region, consisting of various ports in the region of which the Amsterdam port is the largest. The city council of Amsterdam has appointed the Port Authority for the management, operation and development of the port of Amsterdam. The Port Authority has become independent since 2013, with the Municipality of Amsterdam as the sole shareholder. The Port Authority manages over 1,900 hectares of port area, such as port sites, discharging and loading quays, roads, railways and 600 hectares of waterways.

AEB Amsterdam, together with partners, has been solving waste issues for many years. AEB also became independent in 2014, with the Municipality of Amsterdam as the sole shareholder. In 2019 it was decided to give priority to AEB's core activities. AEB has a High Efficiency Power Plant, which is based on proven technology and innovations of AEB. The High Efficiency Power Plant has been developed to optimise the output of energy and raw materials. In addition, the High Efficiency Power Plant is clean: the flue gas cleaning has been designed with the aim to achieve the lowest possible emissions.

The water company that cleans, purifies and supplies waste water to 1.3 million people who live and work in Amsterdam and large parts of the provinces of Utrecht and North Holland. Waternet is also concerned with keeping surface water clean and up to level in this varied area with plenty of water, nature, towns and villages.

Waternet is the joint organisation of the Regional Public Water Authority Amstel, Gooi and Vecht and the municipality of Amsterdam. The Municipality of Amsterdam is responsible for the sewer system, groundwater and drinking water. The Regional Public Water Authority is responsible for surface water and wastewater purification. The Regional Public Water Authority is not an insured with regard to the present contract.



Royal Carré and restaurants

1. The Amsterdam-Amstelland safety region, which includes the Fire Brigade, does also not fall under this contract and has a separate policy.
2. The Police are not covered by this contract and they are nationally insured elsewhere for liability.
3. Medical institutions such as hospitals are not included under the reinsurance contract.
4. However, the Public Health Service of Amsterdam (GGD) is included in the insurance. The GGD actively monitors and promotes the health of the population in the work areas of Amsterdam, Aalsmeer, Amstelveen, Diemen, Ouder-Amstel and Uithoorn.

The aim of the GGD is to reduce health gaps and to improve the participation and self-reliance of residents. Disease prevention, health promotion and interventions are organised to achieve this goal. <https://www.ggd.amsterdam.nl/>
