We publish this information notice to notify all Relevant Market Parties of questions we have received regarding the Market Consultation, and our answers to these questions. 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| QUESTION 1 | <p>We understand from Appendix 6 that the services may be structured by regional lots, with Moldova falling within Lot 4 – Eastern Europe. In this context, could you please confirm whether the envisaged model is that one provider would be expected to act as a single point of contact and coordinator for an entire lot (e.g. Lot 4), potentially supported by local in-country delivery partners?</p> <p>In other words, should interested providers consider that their capability offering would need to cover, at least at a coordination and management level, the full set of countries included in the relevant lot (for Lot 4, for example: Armenia, Azerbaijan, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Georgia, Greece, Hungary, Kazakhstan, North Macedonia, Moldova, Romania,</p> |
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| | Russia, Serbia and Montenegro, Slovakia, Slovenia, Turkey, Ukraine, Albania and Kosovo), even if certain jurisdictions would be serviced through established local partners? |

| Answer | Yes, interested providers should consider that their offered service would need to cover the full set of countries included in the relevant lot. Whether certain countries/jurisdictions would be serviced through the provider (main contractor) or through established local partners (sub-contractors), will be left to the discretion of the provider. However, the provider remains fully responsible for provided services to all countries/jurisdictions in the relevant lot, even if parts are serviced through local partners. |
